- **A.** Update on ongoing projects in Mesilla. **Rod McGillivray, Public Works Director** Mr. McGillivray gave an update on ongoing projects in the Town of Mesilla.
  - Bowman Street construction to begin in May.
  - McDowell Road preconstruction meeting will be held this week
  - McDowell Road construction to begin on March 4<sup>th</sup>
  - Trail design submitted to NMDOT for 60% review
  - Calle de Parian will be out to bid in March; construction will begin after Cinco de Mayo Fiesta
  - Local Government Road Fund application due on the 10th

Mayor Barraza stated the trail project is funded through TAP. We are hoping to get \$82K from Capital Outlay for this project.

## 9. BOARD OF TRUSTEE COMMITTEE REPORTS

Trustee Garcia stated the Santa Fe trip was interesting and informative.

Trustee Arzabal stated CEO committee met. They are trying to get youth to utilize the money that is out there for education.

Mayor Barraza stated that information was shared, and they will be in contact with Mr. Duran.

Trustee Johnson-Burick stated she attended the MPO meeting on February 13<sup>th</sup>. Presentations were made on the Uniform Crash Report and inquiries were made on the status on the interim. The next MPO meeting will be held in April.

## 10. BOARD OF TRUSTEE/STAFF COMMENTS

Trustee Johnson-Burick stated she was honored to welcome the Senior Olympics.

Trustee Garcia stated in the year she has been here she had never seen a breakdown of town projects; thanked Mr. McGillivray. Reiterated Santa Fe was interesting and educational.

Trustee Arzabal stated he will be attending the State of the City of Las Cruces on Thursday. Lt. Governor Morales asked about using Colonia money to improve infrastructure. Lt. Governor Morales could not

- believe Mesilla was not a Colonia. He indicated there is a lot of money which Mesilla is losing out on.
- The Colonia status does not change anything. People that do not want to be designated a Colonia do not attend meetings. He feels the board should consider tapping into that.

1 2 Mayor Barraza responded Lt. Governor Morales was very attentive and asked about our infrastructure needs. Money is available to us if we go through the Colonia process. The House passed the minimum 3 4 wage and tip servers but may not pass the Senate. Our local restaurants and servers, big or small, are 5 against it. She brought concerns up to legislators, Governor Lujan Grisham and Lt. Governor Morales. 6 This trip was well worth it. There will be a worksession on Animal Control Ordinance on March 11<sup>th</sup> and 7 up for approval at the March 25<sup>th</sup> meeting. She is working on the Sign Ordinance; joint worksession will be held with Planning and Zoning. The Fire Code Ordinance has been submitted with revisions. At the 8 9 second Board of Trustees meeting in March she will be appointing a new Mayor Pro Tem and committee representatives. There will be an RTD meeting on Wednesday afternoon. She will not be attending the 10 State of the City of Las Cruces address but is happy to know that Trustee Arzabal will be representing the 11 12 Town of Mesilla. She thanked Mr. McGillivray for his good job on the projects. She feels confident 13 that at least four, if not all five, of our projects will receive Capital Outlay funding.
