- 2. Discussion on 2017-2018 FY Budget & Fiscal Year End Report for the Town of Mesilla– Cynthia Stoehner-Hernandez, Clerk-Treasurer.
- 47 Ms. Stoehner-Hernandez gave a presentation of 2016-2017 FY

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1 Trustee Caro stated compared to other communities our Marshal's Department looks high. He

- 2 feels it should be limited to four (4) officers. Other than that it looks really good.
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Mayor Barraza stated it is a good summary. We received less in revenue that what was 4 projected. This is not due to the GRT but to other sources coming in. There were a couple of 5 budgets that were not at 100% so they were used to cover the losses. We are still questioning our 6 GRT which we feel should be higher. We will be attending a Gross Receipt Tax Workshop in 7 Albuquerque on Friday and those are some of the questions we will be asking. As she speaks to 8 business owners and residents we say how we have seen an increase in population around the 9 plaza. We have seen the 2% increase as projected but we feel it should be more. Some 10 municipalizes have hired attorneys to look at Gross Receipts and have discovered that the 11 Taxation Department is short changing municipalities. The town did very well this last fiscal 12 year where as other municipalities have had to lay off staff. We will continue to focus on 13 promoting tourism; doing the best we can with the monies we have. Ms. Parra has done a great 14 job in promoting the town. She also commends the Department Heads who have been very 15 protective of their budgets and still providing services to our constituents. This fiscal year we 16 will be looking at raising the connection fees for services due to cost of repairing roads during 17 the connection process. 18

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Mayor Pro Tem Arzabal stated it is our responsibility to have a balanced budget as the Board of Finance. He will never forget that our employees had to be put at 32 hours. That was the hardest

- vote he ever had to make.

Mayor Barraza stated staff tries to plan ahead by checking their budgets. We are still able to come up with a balanced budget and provide services to our constituents. She asked if the board is okay with the way they are receiving reports or would they like it changed.

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Trustee Caro responded everything is coming along good. There was a revolving door in the Public Works but he feels there is a good combination now. This year the parks and grounds are looking good. Staff is working and not just riding around and it shows.

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- 32 Mayor Barraza indicated that will be shared with the Public Works staff.
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Trustee Flores stated she is concerned what we have received in Clean and Beautiful Grant and what is being projected. She recommends looking closely at what we have received and what we

- are projecting. She is putting faith in Ms. Stoehner-Hernandez and the Mayor that the increase is
 for a reason.

Mayor Barraza responded when Ms. Stoehner-Hernandez submits the budget, we have submitted an application for the grant; that is what we are requesting. The actual amount will be what we have been awarded; we cannot spend more than what has been awarded. There is a lot of competition so we are fortunate for what we receive.

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Ms. Stoehner-Hernandez responded we budgeted \$32,000 which may change; we are waiting for the paperwork from the state.

- Mayor Barraza responded that was in Ms. Parra's report. It was for graffiti and beautification. Ms. Stoehner-Hernandez added it is also for the dog park. She did a recap of the final fiscal year budget 2017-2018. Trustee Flores asked for an explanation of why the building inspector contract was removed. Ms. Stoehner-Hernandez responded that there have been a few issues. We are looking a revising our permitting/review fees to recoup some of those funds. Mayor Barraza stated most of our dialogue has been with the state so we felt we should go through the state versus having to go through the building inspector as a cost saving. We keep a close eye on our Gross Receipt Tax which we have projected a 2.5% increase for 2017-2018 fiscal year; if we see that the town is doing better than the 2.5% we may come back to the board in December to ask for a COLA increase for the employees. We will look if it is doable and we are comfortable with it in meeting our obligations. Mayor Barraza closed Work Session at 5:38 p.m.
