27	wage increase ordinance so it has to pay what they pay and have a higher tax rate. Does not feel		
28	it is appropriate 4.5 months into the budget we are giving a selected department raises; it should		
29	have been done at the beginning of the budget. It is no doubt they deserve it. We are going to		
30	create equity issues with other employees; potential liability concerns. There should be overall		
31	compensation and classification packet done on every job description. Reiterated the City of Las		
32	Cruces has the minimum ordinance. She cannot justify the increases. Some of other entities have		
33 34	a larger tax base. We should have looked at Hatch and Sunland Park. She understands that the Enterprise Funds are not to be used for personnel and operation. We raised the water rates to
